## Legislative leaders,

Washington's transportation and infrastructure system is vital to the wellbeing of our communities and the statewide economy. As we all know, there is a significant need for transportation investments across the state. We can no longer wait to make meaningful investments or postpone needed maintenance and preservation. If we do, costs will continue to balloon along with the risk of damaging system failures that harm our communities, environment, and economy.

The AWC membership calls for a robust and equitable approach to transportation investments but opposes the proposed large sweep of the Public Works Assistance Account. While we commend you for addressing the state's transportation needs in the Move Ahead WA package, we also know that our system is an integrated one that relies on both state and locally owned transportation assets. Moreover, transportation infrastructure is just one piece of an interconnected infrastructure system that includes drinking water, wastewater, stormwater, and other basic needs. For this reason, the PWAA is a foundational source of funding that provides essential support for critical infrastructure projects.

In recent years the PWAA has awarded funds for projects like the Fairview Ave N. Bridge replacement in Seattle, wastewater treatment plant facility improvements in North Bend, and repairs to the water system of Malden after the 2020 Babb Road wildfire. However, while these critical projects have received funding support from the PWAA, many other projects have not. This is because the needs far outpace availability of funds. Currently, the Public Works Board has \$1 billion in vital projects that can complete construction within the next four years only if funding is secured.

This year, cities identified statewide transportation investments, including funding for local preservation and maintenance needs, as a legislative priority. We also identified traditional infrastructure investments as a priority, given the many ongoing needs that are continually deferred during difficult economic periods. We know that Washington's interconnected infrastructure system must be well maintained and preserved for a strong economy and healthy communities. Thus, cities support an approach that invests in the whole transportation system while preserving local ability to fund other infrastructure needs.

We understand the challenge of balancing investments in transportation with limited transportation revenues. However, the state is in a unique position to meet this call, as revenue forecasts demonstrate significant growth and economic recovery. Given the close ties between the state's transportation system and locally owned infrastructure, we urge you to look for options that preserve investments in both. Cities are a committed partner in furthering the success of our state and we ask that the Legislature to work with us on transportation and infrastructure investments that support Washington's future.
